Born in the Bay Ridge section of Brooklyn, Herb moved to EHT when he was 13. He attended the Cardiff school, and graduated from Atlantic City High School in 1960.

Herb is predeceased by his mother, Helen (Ross) and father, Herbert, Sr. He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Judy (Childs), his brother, John "Jack" Niewender, daughters, Carol Goloff, Suzanne George, Kristine Howell, and sons-in-law, Michael Goloff, Rowland George, and Roger Howell. Pop Pop is also survived by his grandchildren, Rowland George, Bronson George, Joshua Goloff, Rachel Goloff, Madison Howell and Grant Howell.

As a young man, Herb was a Cub Scout then moved on to the Bluejackets, a navel mascot organization, which he remembered fondly throughout his life.

As an adult, he had many careers. Herb was an expert mechanic for Ford. He then became one of the nation's top Ford salesmen selling 18 wheelers and tractor trailers during the gas crisis in the 1970s. Herb later owned and operated Niewender Equipment Company and Little John's Towing. Herb served on the EHT MUA, the Board of Education, and as a Legislative Aid to Senator William Gormley. For a man without a college degree, he was proud of being a self taught computer programmer, an instructor at Atlantic Cape Community College, and a formidable adversary in any court of law.

Herb was a proud American. He never did what was popular, but rather, what was right.
